The Education Programme

The education program is running in two zones, one is in Murshidabad where five educational centres are running with 535 students and 10 teachers and another is at Kumirmari - Sundarban area where 16 educational centres are running with 1552 students and 79 teachers. Out of 2087,100 students were newly enrolled in Kumirmari education centres during the period of 2017.In Murshidabad, the five education centres are situated at Ikrol. Palsanda. Gopgram, Diara and Samsdabad under Nabagram block and 16 education centres in Kumirmari Village is situated under Gosaba block, South 24 Parganas. (please check the figures from the current table given). We distributed school materials like pen, pencil, eraser, sharpener, note books of different sizes, drawing book and crayons among the students of all classes.



We organize Anti Child Labour campaign, Anti Illiteracy Awareness Campaign. Currently MACHRD is working on a project entitled "Schooling Reinforcement and Holistic Development of Children Programme". It runs 16 morning schools in Sunderban in Gosaba block. There are 1552 Students in these schools belonging to Nursery to class six. There are 769 are Male and 783 are Female Students. All belong to the poorest families. MACHRD also organizes #Daan Utsab so that people can share the joy of giving with its students.

COVID-19 IMPACT

The attendance rate is quite same in 2020 session, from Jan to Mar. After lockdown from 23rd March, the classes remain closed due to Covid 19 pandemic. From July 2020, teachers of both zones doing their job as enacted educators and health promoters. As educators they are providing home education assistance through their home visit and give educational support to the children as well as interacting with guardians to continue their study and do friendlier behavior with their children during the crisis situation [a psychosocial interaction to fight with this situation with less mental pressure]. And other side, as a health promoters they are delivering awareness information on Covid 19 prevention steps, distributing mask, soap and also do awareness session on health – hygiene – diet and cleanliness to maintain a healthy life and ailments less life.

<u>Limitation during the years:</u>

- 1. Sundarbans faced three sever devastated cyclone periodically Fani [3rd May 2019], Bulbul [9th Nov 2019] and Amphan [20th May 2020]. The cyclone destroyed the education center and it took time to resume the classes. During the time, the attendance is quite less as they had not proper place to sit.
- 2. Heavy rain, monsoon that also reduced the students' attendance

The Health Programme

MACHRD is running one health service centre in Kumirmari village where the sponsor children as well as their family members come for treatment. We have two doctors, one is allopath doctor who attends on every Tuesday and another is homoeopath doctor who attends every day. Besides doctor's checkups, we dispensed medicines free of cost as prescribed by doctors. Though the clinic is for children yet family members of the children and community people also come for treatment. In 2019, we have treatedpatients and out of that are by allopath doctor and are by homoeopath doctor.








Conclusion

Majhipara Ambedkar Centre for Human Research and Development is convinced and is a believer of the maxim that a good healthy mother is instrumental in making a good healthy family which in turn ensures a good healthy society, culminating ultimately into a resounding and vibrant Nation. As a major activity, MACHRD organizes and conducts health camps in rural segments. In such camps, economically weak women and children are given preference for free health checkup, Besides, we have organized camps for Hepatitis B vaccination, Thalassaemia preliminary blood test.

The Nutrition Programme

In Kumirmari, the socio-economic condition of the villagers is very poor. They used to take improper food, impure drinking water even they are not able to take their normal food in time. As the education centres are running early in the morning, maximum students are unable to come with their breakfast or food. To avoid such fasting we provided them biscuits, usually and also some other supplementary food, occasionally. This helps them to keep their health fit and healthy. By getting such small support children as well as parents are feel happy and tension free. Usually, we provided 4 biscuits daily before starting the educational centres. Besides supplementary food, we also organized awareness sessions periodically with all students and their parents and also take their height and weight twice in year for BMI calculation to track their nutritional status.









Nutritional Aids Witnessed

- 1. 2019 = All children of Sundarbans got 4 biscuits every school day according to their attendance
- 2. 2020 = all children of Sundarbans got 4 biscuits every school day according to their attendance till March 2020. After that they got biscuits packet weekly at their doorsteps by the educator during teachers' home education assistance services.

Our main motto to observe the day is to empower the women and they get all rights and respects from their family and society and lead a happy life.1500 paricipants



World Water Day: on 20th to 22nd March, we have observed the World Water Day to aware the people to save the water and drink safe water. Program coordinators of two zones, few teachers and students gave short lectures / speeches to aware the people and motivate them to save water, stop wasting of water by any means, and drink safe and pure water for the sake of their healthy life and r environment.

Besides those programs, we have celebrated our Foundation Day on 14 th Marh, the day of Ambedkar Jyanti. Independence Day of India, Saraswati Puja, Rakshna bandhan, children's day, teacher"s Day, Literacy Day,International Day for Elemination of discrimination against women,World"s AIDS Day,Day against Child labour and women trafficking, etc. Such celebrations make people aware and help them to be united and happy and aware about the day..

Teachers' Training: On 2nd September one teachers' training workshop was conducted at Kumirmari centres. It was one day training by the external resources to train up our teachers for better teaching process.,,,,teachers and few other project staff participated into the training programme. It was very interesting and knowledgeable learning session for them





Holistic development:Due to our program, a holistic development among the community for their betterment. Due to our educational support parents, especially the girls child and their parents are motivated to sent their children at school and continued their study as extend they can run.The dropout rate has been reduced. Also school education material is provided.

The Educational Centers

I.Kumirmari Island, Sundarbans where 14 educational centers are operating for formal teaching support and social education support among the children and their parents – guardians. The Sundarbans Education Centers are located at different villages of Gosaba Block under supervision and monitoring of Sundarbans Project Office i.e. Vill & P.O - Kumirmari , Block -Gosaba, South 24 Parganas, West Bengal-743378, India.

II. Murshidabad where 5 educational centers located at three Gram Panchayats [GP - village council] that are operating for the deprived children and their community. The five educational centers are Gopgram, Palsanda under Narayanpur GP, Samsabad, Diara under Barala GP and Ikrol under Nabagram GP and the project office at Berhampur. The GPs are under Sagardighi Block [Samsabad, Diara] and Nabagram Block [Palsanda, Gopgram, Ikrol], Murshidabad district.

Children Lives Impacted

Our direct beneficiaries are 1860 children of both zones and primary benefitted families are 1675. The total community benefitted approximately 6000 people that include guardians, parents, and other community members of both genders through curative as well as preventive actions of program.

Health Impact

Last year 2603 patients were treated by both doctors that include 1058 allopath footfalls 1545 homoeopath footfalls. and cumulatively. Uniquely the number of beneficiaries is 890 who took at least one health curative services from allopath clinics. And in other side 1397 footfalls are unique footfalls who took at least one health curative services from homoeopath clinic. It means 2287 [87.9%] are unique patients' footfalls during the year and 316 [12.1%] patients took multiple visits / follow up visits for their illnesses
